



Welcome to OUT ON SCREEN Vancouver's 5th Annual Lesbian and Gay Film Festival

March 26 - 30 marks the dates of Vancouver's Fifth Annual Lesbian and Gay Film Festival. Five years! Where did the time go?! Where were you in '92? Have you been there, done that, seen all? If not, do we have some films for you.

Each year we move one step closer to professionalism and maturity. This year our giant step was hiring a full-time administrator and securing an office with a phone and everything. Our thanks to Gay Hawley (aforementioned administrator) for putting up with us, organizing the office and doing most of the hard work.

A sure sign of Out On Screen's growth was our decision to send Robert Rothon (one of our devoted programmers) to the Berlin Film Festival where he rubbed elbows with the "who's who" of gay and lesbian filmmaking and distribution. As a result, we managed to make some valuable connections and put a name on the map for Vancouver's festival.

Another big step for Out On Screen is the addition of two forums on gender crossover to the festival line-up. Both forums are free and will follow the 7 o'clock screenings at Robson Square. Keep an eye out for more details.

For all those people who complained about having to work late or drive in from the suburbs or take their Aunt Lidia's dog for a walk - we are selling advance tickets at the theatres 45 minutes before showtime. You will have to take your chances on opening night, but for all other screenings, check this programme and rush down to Pacific Cinematheque or Robson Square to get the best seats in the house.

By the way, how many of you entered our Instant Video Star contest? If you missed it this year, we were so impressed by the quality of the entries that we will be making it an annual event. All you have to do is come up with an idea that can be developed in five minutes or less. This year's winners will be screened during the festival.

On the subject of budding gay and lesbian filmmakers, Out On Screen has been talking about setting up a scholarship fund for gay and lesbian filmmakers since 1989. Well, this year we are doing something about it by donating the proceeds of our benefit screening to the fund. If you support the cause or just want to see Sex Is... and The Dead Boy's Club, set aside \$10 for Sunday evening's benefit screening.

My thanks to the board members, committee heads and volunteers who have put their hearts and souls into the organizing of the festival. And thanks also to the businesses and individuals who have sponsored films or advertised in our programme. Let them know you appreciate them by shopping at their stores or eating their food or using their services. Enjoy the films and videos, attend the forums and have fun watching your images on the screen.



Introduction to Men's Programming

The men's programming committee has worked very hard to put together this year's program. It's a strong one, with an unusually wide range: from a Nazi musical to a really sexy AIDS documentary.

Speaking of AIDS, we can't help but sound a note of alarm over the fact that so many young independent gay filmmakers have HIV. We need to realize that filmmaking is a very time and money consuming form of expression, and that this means that all these young artists may only produce a handful of films. Perhaps this is what lesbian and gay film festivals can do best: present their films and celebrate their talents before they are taken from us, with many wonderful films unmade.

We were thinking a while back that cross dressing, and even androgyny, isn't quite what it used to be. Nonetheless, there's nothing like the idea of men in frocks to throw some of us into a male panic. After all, what you wear, or choose not to wear, is a manifesto of sorts. Wash and wear, or dry clean only, clothes are politics. Hence our decision to pay tribute to cross dressing in some of our films this year, and to organize a symposium (men on uniforms) on the issue.

Next year (we always like to dream about next year even before the current festival ends) we will be offering you a retrospective of Canadian films. Who knows if in a year's time we'll still be in a blue funk (pout?) about the national debt or about the prospect of La Campbell as prime minister. But if we are, or even if we're not, it will be a great opportunity to take stock of where we've come from, where we've been, and how our artists, both queer and straight, have represented us.

Thanks for coming, and enjoy. You can even hate it if you want to, just as long as you come back.





Viktor und Viktoria 1933, Germany, english subtitles, 100 mins. directed by Reinhold Schunzel

This is not the Blake Edwards 1982 film of roughly the same name starring Julie Andrews (and a rather butch Julie Andrews at that): this is the original!

Victor und Victoria is the first German feature length musical comedy. Its musical idiom is unusual to say the least (Lehar goes to Broadway), and the story, with its tiny but rather wonderful lesbian subtext, is atypical for its period.

The story is that of a down and out cabaret artiste (Hermann Thimig) who launches a sweet young thing's career by turning her into a female impersonator. Renate Muller is a pretty femmy Viktor and has to warble some particularly ghastly songs. Thimig was a master of slapstick, and his audition scene, where he just murders Shakespeare (or is it Schiller?) is a classic, sweat-beaded brow and all.

Though not what you'd call a queer classic, **Viktor und Viktoria** introduces in a truly charming fashion this year's theme of androgyny and cross dressing.

Out On Screen's Instant Video Star Contest

Entries to the video contest, open to any and all "camcording queers" ranged from the charmingly gaudy (a drag queen singing in the snow) to the totally cosmic.

Five winners in all were chosen: All of them will be screened on the opening night of the festival. The first prize, a course at the Vancouver Film School valued at \$600 goes to a woman who did a sensational Karen Carpenter impersonation, Janet Noude, for her entry **Hard to Get to Know.** Second prize of a membership at Video In goes to Linda Hancock for her entry **Odd Gals Out**. Elder lesbian love scenes and erotic gay sex are cut with reconstructions of gay history in Barbara Hammer's visually mesmerizing experimental style. Utilizing outtakes and clips, interwoven with an assortment of other materials, including footage from German narrative feature films of the thirties, interviews, period music and shots of three couples making love, she offers a different set of images about gay and lesbian life than those which have previously emerged. Nitrate Kisses is a representation which operates on many levels, including allegorical, historical and erotic.



Il Etait une Fois dans L'est

(Once Upon a Time in the East) 1974, Canada, english subtitles. directed by Andre Brassard

With its screaming east end Montreal drag queens in hot pants and lace up sandals, Il Etait une Fois dans L'Est serves as an introduction to the world of Quebec playwright Michel Tremblay. Long considered French Canada's leading playwright, Tremblay has written almost exclusively about scathingly depressed working class women and exultantly defiant drag queens.

Il Etait une Fois dans L'Est mixes and matches characters and plot lines from several of his plays. The plot most familiar to Vancouver audiences will be the one about Hosannah heading off to the ball in his best Liz Taylor as Cleopatra outfit. Roughly contemporary with Outrageous, Il Etait une Fois dans L'Est has now found a new lease on life as a classic of the gay and lesbian film festival circuit.

Madame Simone 1992, Canada, 12 min.

directed by Martin Allard

Twenty years down the road, it's more joie de vivre in drag with the outerspace queen of the Montreal scene. A modern day Joan of Arc, Mme. Simone hears voices in her head and follows them, tottering on her platforms, to wherever they might lead her: Will Wigstock the same?

Safer Sex is here to stay but putting safer practices into our lives is a difficult transition for many. Nobody gets turned on by lists of do's and don'ts. This tape eroticizes safer practices and latex use for a plurisexual audience.

She Thrills Me 1993, Canada, 12 min.

directed by Maureen Bradley

So, dykes don't talk about sex enough? "She Thrills Me" shows women speaking their sexuality, speaking their pleasure. From vanilla to SM, women articulate what thrills them.

Lovie's Legacy for Dyke Dates 1993, Canada, 8 mins.

HIRSUTE, HER SUIT



Body Hair 1989, Canada, 10 mins.

directed by Carla Wolf

An investigation of personal, social and political realities of white, middle class women and their body hair. What gets shaved, plucked, bleached, and what gets permed, primped and glorified. Interviews with several women are interwoven with ads and research into the history of hair removal.

Juggling Gender 1992, USA, 27 min.

directed by Tami Gold

A loving portrait of Jennifer Miller, a lesbian performer who lives her life with a full beard. Miller works as a performance artist, circus director, clown and as the "bearded lady" in one of the only remaining sideshows in America. In public she is often mistaken for a man, an experience she handles with the wit and intelligence that characterize her stage performances. Her lifestyle suggest the impossibility of defining anyone as truly feminine or masculine. Juggling Gender explores the fluidity of gender and raises important questions about construction of sexual and gender identity.

Framing Lesbian Fashion 1992, USA, 59 min.

directed by Karen Everett

In Framing Lesbian Fashion, viewers take a fascinating time trip through the evolution of lesbian dress codes and identities - butch/femme, flannel, androgyny, cross-dressing and drag, queer fluorescence, S/M and leather, lipstick, and more.

Followed by Symposium HIRSUTE, HER SUIT

A panel/audience discussion following up on some issues raised in the screenings such as codifying lesbian identity, fashion, crossdressing, gender identification, butch/femme, and images and representations of lesbians.

Okoge 1992, Japan, subtitled, 120 mins. directed by Takehiro Nakalima

Funny, sad, satirical, poignant, and well-acted, Okoge is an insightful look at gay life in Japan today. This candid, intimate story of the ups and downs in an affair between a married salary-man and his younger, self-employed lover, is seen through the eyes of the young woman who lets them use her bed when they have no place else to go. In Japanese the word okoge is the slang equivalent to the English term "fag hag". Literally it refers to the crust of rice that sticks to the bottom of the pot.

THE CYBERDYKE MOVIE



Flaming Ears 1991, Austria, english subtitles, 81 min. directed by Angela Hans Scheirl, Ursula Purror, Dietmar Schipek

Flaming Ears is a pop sci-fi lesbian fantasy feature set in the year 2700 in the fictive burned-out city of Asche. It follows the tangled lives of three women - Volley, Nun and Spy. Spy is a comic-book artist whose printing presses are burned down by Volley, a sexed-up pyromaniac. Seeking revenge, Spy goes to the lesbian club where Volley performs every night. Before she can enter, Spy gets into a fight and is left wounded, lying in the street. She is found by Nun, an amoral alien in a red plastic suit with a predilection for reptiles, and who also happens to be Volley's lover. Mun takes her home and subsequently must hide her from Volley. It's a story of love and revenge, and an anti-romantic plea for love in its many forms. An avowedly underground film which was shot on Super 8 and blown up to 16mm, Flaming Ears is original for its playful disruption of narrative conventions, its witty approach to film genre, and its visual splendor.

MEN ON UNIFORMS



Split - William to Chrysis, Portrait of a Drag Queen 1992, USA, 58 min.

directed by Andrew Weeks, Ellen Fisher Turk

When asked what fascinated her the most about Chrysis, the subject of **Split**, producer Ellen Fisher Turk answered: her breasts. You'll understand why once you've seen this film.

Split, an unusually tender portrait of a drag queen who was an all American show girl and Salvadore Dali's muse. The film's almost new age sweetness is a far cry from the Kamikaze tragic bitchiness more typical of the genre. A labour of love, which according to director Andrew Weeks took up most of Ms. Turk's alimony.

The Jane Show 1992, Canada, 39 min.

directed by Mozi Mossanen

With its wonderful opening a la Mary Tyler Moore Show, The Jane Show proves itself to be a great starring vehicle for Toronto playwright Sky Gilbert. No, they don't all wear tie-dyed tutus and yes, they do seem to have this thing about goat rituals. Children of nature, radical faeries have this uncanny capacity to unnerve urban, straight identified gay men.

Faerie Tales is an amiable meander past some truly interesting fashion statements and their ideological underpinnings. In a playful way, this film challenges our assumptions about masculine behavior and appearance.





Relive a seventies world of promiscuity, hot guys and glitter balls, and go home humming its disco theme song (which by the way, would make just a dandy bondage music video).




