





Whether you're making a one-night commitment to the Vancouver Queer Film Festival or you're in it for the long haul, getting onto the pink carpet has never been easier.

#### Tickets Sold Out?

It is never hopeless! Try the Hope Line! There are usually rush tickets available at the door.
A generous allotment of seats is reserved for
Passholders, but often seats are not used.
These seats are released to the Hope Line 15

Festival Passes purchased online will be mailed. Tickets purchased through TicketsTonight.ca can be picked up at the Will Call Table at the corresponding Theatre on the day of the screening. Only the credit card holder may pick up the tickets with valid photo ID. Please arrive 30 minutes in advance. Tickets only available at Will Call for same day screenings.

Whether you have a Festival Pass or a ticket or you are heading for the Hope Line, we have a queue for you. Arrive early and check out the audience before the lights go out.

#### Seeing 2 screenings in a row?

All Passholders and patrons holding tickets for the next screening in the same Theatre will be allowed to stay in their seats if they choose (we understand that this is a great makeout time). While it is possible to take a break and leave the Theatre, we ask that you remain in your seats until Festival Volunteers have verified your telephone. tickets and screening slips

#### **Theatre Etiquette**

Patience is a virtue. Our Festival Volunteers are working hard to make things run as smoothly as possible. Take advantage of time spent in lines to meet your neighbour and have flirty fun.

Please note holding a seat for friends in the Hope Line may in fact impede their ability to get into the Theatre (it is okay if they have Passes or tickets). We only sell tickets to the Hope Line if there are free seats available in the Theatre.

Turn off (or put on vibrate) cellphones and digital devices and refrain from using cameras.

#### **OUT IN SCHOOLS**

Out in Schools is our new education program garnering critical acclaim. Launched in 2004, we bring independent queer films into BC high schools and talk with students about the issues that affect queer youth.

Out in Schools aims to increase understanding through education to combat issues such as homophobia and bullying that threaten the safety of our classrooms for both queer and straight students. Last year we reached over 1900 students in 42 presentations!

#### FIRSTOUT YOUNG FILMMAKERS

FirstOUT Video is an intensive video boot camp for queer youth. The initiative brings four celebrated independent media artists together with queer youth to work with them on developing their own cultural voice and producing their first video.

- Produce a second commissioned piece with John Greyson, Richard Fung and Ali Kazimi, that reveals the story of Rex vs. Singh, a sodomy trial that occurred in association with the Komagata Maru incident in 1915.
- Research and commission up to three more collaborative works.

#### QUEER HISTORY PROJECT

Through the Queer History Project, we are commissioning films that record and tell queer experiences from the past to ensure our stories are captured and told for generations. We envision the project will produce a lasting body of work that will enable our stories to take their rightful place in Canadian history.

Currently in the works is a collaborative film project by Veda Hille and Ivan E. Coyote that tells the stories of queer seniors in Vancouver. Premiering at this year's Festival, this important work is our first commissioned film.

While on army reserve duty, Israeli Noam meets Ashraf, a Palestinian living in Nablus, at a checkpoint in the West Bank. Undeniably attracted to one another, Ashraf seeks Noam out in Tel Aviv, and they embark on a passionate affair. In the cosmopolitan streets of Tel Aviv, the two exist in a bubble where they are hidden from the realities of the warring factions that surround them. Together with Noam's roommates Lulu and Yali they start crafting a new identity for Ashraf, complete with an Israeli name, a new job and new clothes. Despite this fragile optimism, though, the violence of the intifada begins to encroach on their lives.



Beautiful but lonely Francesca is frustrated with her lot, driving a taxi by day and taking care of her overbearing father and impetuous sister by night. When her sister Antonietta takes off on Christmas Eve to join her rocker boyfriend in Rotterdam, Francesca is dispatched to bring her home. On the way, she picks up the beguilling Gerlinde, a woman stranded by a car accident (played divinely by legendary German actress Hannelore Elsner). And so begins a nocturnal journey that will bring these women together and, as they confront their personal demons, forever change the trajectories of their lives.

Structured in three sections, the film weaves together the events of the evening from each woman's perspective. Francesca, weary from her role as caregiver to her motherless family, looks to the much older Gerlinde for salvation, and, in one unforgettable scene, physical love. Gerlinde, herself in need of saving, is nursing a broken heart; her lover—a married woman—refuses to leave her husband. And Antonietta, full of youthful rebellion, has found love, but must find her footing in the uncertain ground of burgeoning adulthood.

In this captivating follow-up to *Unveiled* (winner of the People's Choice Award at VQFF 2006), director Angelina Maccarone once again reveals her talents as a filmmaker at the height of her powers. Maccarone effortlessly weaves a tale that addresses both loneliness and hope, and the profound moments of connection, so rare among strangers, that can punctuate our lives.



Billed as the first gay sequel (the first installment was an audience favourite at VQFF 2004), **Eating Out 2** is like a present-day *Three's Company* where, sexually speaking, everyone is pretending to be something they're not and madcap antics and mix-ups abound. Except in this version the men are actually queer and we get to see them

Co-written by festival favourite Q Allan Brocka (Boy Culture, Rick & Steve: The Happiest Gay Couple in All the World), Eating Out 2 playfully sends up the notion of becoming an"ex-gay". American Idol alum Jim Verraros plays Kyle, who thinks the best way to lure in the new nude model in town is to pretend to be newly straight. The only problem is that Kyle's ex-boyfriend also has his sights set on the new guy, so it's a race to see who gets him first, and how. Soon confusion and arousal reach their climax, and the film delivers the goods thanks to a steady stream of naked torsos in some steamy soft-core scenes that end up proving the futility of any quest that attempts to make an "ex" of a "gay".



# **GLUE**

One of the more visually striking films of this year's line-up, **Glue** is a beautifully rendered tale of adolescence in the sun-drenched landscapes of Patagonia. Inspired in part by director Alexis Dos Santos' own coming of age in the 70s, the film introduces us to Lucas, a gangly, frustrated teenager whose questions about sexuality are just beginning to be answered. Lustful of his best friend Nacho, but also intrigued by Andrea, the new girl in his life, Lucas spends his days playing in a rock band, obsessing about sex and riding his bike with his headphones on.

Juxtaposing the vast, loping landscape with the cacophony of Western punk music (the *Violent Femmes* figure prominently), **Glue** reveals the intricacies of Lucas' sexual discovery with a hypnotic, impressionistic beauty. This accomplished first feature from Argentine director Dos Santos is emblematic of a new generation of South American filmmakers bringing unique, visionary works to the international stage.

# PUCCINI FOR BEGINNERS

Stylish and urbane novelist Allegra is dumped by her girlfriend, and despite her reluctance to fall in love again, finds herself caught up in a sticky (pun intended!), sexuality-bending love triangle with a man, adorably nerdy professor Philip (Justin Kirk from Angels in America), and a straight woman, effervescent Grace (the rather fetching Gretchen Mol). Allegra's love troubles build to an operatic climax, and she is forced to come to terms with her own commitment-phobia.

Delving into its theme of sexual fluidity with wit and panache, director Maggenti more than satisfies with this follow-up to her first feature, The Incredibly True Adventures of 2 Girls in Love. 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






Precocious teenager Jade (Taiwanese pop star Rainie Yang) has her own soft porn site. Being a webcam girl eases her loneliness and feeds her fascination with fantasy, but falls far short of satisfying her deepest desires.

Jade harbours a long-simmering love for a girl from her past-the strong, silent Takeko (rising Hong Kong star Isabella Leong), who now runs a tattoo parlour in Taipei. Estranged friends from long ago, the two meet again when Jade approaches Takeko for a tattoo-the same spider lily that Takeko has on her arm. The tattoo emerges as a powerful image in both their lives-for Jade it represents maturity and emotional connection while for Takeko it remains a constant reminder of tragedies from the past. Blooming between them, the spider lily represents both a dark shadow and a fragile, enduring beauty.

A tender, powerful story of lost love, conflicting loyalties and of the blurring of reality and illusion, **Spider Lilies** is a beautifully crafted film about what we owe ourselves, and one another.

This film is not for everyone. If you're not into blood splatter, blatant diva behaviour, jet-black comedy and outrageous plotlines, I'd stay away. But for the rest of you, this may be one of the most memorable (and dare it be said: enjoyable) film experiences of the summer.

The delectably-titled Suffering Man's Charity is actor Alan Cumming's selfdescribed "passion project" and pitchblack farce that sets out to prove that hell hath no fury like, well, a strange little man scorned. Making his solo directorial debut, Cumming casts himself in the lead role of John Vandermark, a failed composer with a weakness for impoverished young men of great aspirations. The man who scorns John is hunky Sebastian St. Germain (David Boreanaz, of TV's Buffy the Vampire Slayer, Angel and Bones), described by John as "a bankrupt man-whore with the I.Q. of a rash".

The film is teeming with juicy theatrical brio and offers fierce performances from both Boreanaz and the consummate chameleon Cumming. Look out for cameos by Anne Heche, Carrie Fisher, Karen Black (Karen Black!!) and Jane Lynch.
