



# About Us

## OUT ON SCREEN 20 YEARS IN THE MAKING!

Vancouver's first lesbian film festival is held at the Van East Cinema. Key organizers include Laiwan and the Vancouver Lesbian Network, Patrice Leung, Diane Belanger, Emma Kivisild and Myrna McLaughlin.

Out On Screen is officially incorporated as a non-profit society and the first Vancouver Gay & Lesbian Film Festival is launched in anticipation of the upcoming Gay Games. See side bar for Founding Members.

Vancouver hosts the 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Gay Games. Out On Screen adds an arts and cultural component to the mix with an 11-day film festival.

Out On Screen receives its first form of government funding with a Casino License through BC Gaming.

Out On Screen is one of the first film festivals around the world to adopt the word "queer" and becomes the "Vancouver Queer Film & Video Festival".

1995-1999

Video In Studios partners with Out On Screen to co-produce the Festival.

997 Nearly a decade after its inception, Out On Screen receives its first Canada Council grant.

The inaugural year of the Queer Video Production Scholarships. In the next six years, 36 videos are produced through this video training program.

The BC Film Classification Office (FCO) attempts to shut down the Festival's Opening Gala film *Little Sister's vs. Big Brother*, ironically a film about censorship. The Out On Screen membership rallies together, the FCO withdraws and the show goes on.

Out in Schools is launched as a pilot project with presentations in six high schools.

The Festival does another name change, this time simplifying to the "Vancouver Queer Film Festival."
REAL Women of Canada launches a public campaign claiming the Festival is a waste of taxpayers' dollars. Again, the Out On Screen membership rallies behind the Festival and funding continues.

#### **OUT ON SCREEN TODAY**

What began 20 years ago as a small film festival has grown to become a media arts organization that champions queer communities through three core programs:



Celebrating the best in independent queer cinema, the Vancouver Queer Film Festival is Vancouver's second largest film festival and the largest queer arts event in Western Canada. More than just film, the Festival hosts performances, workshops, panel discussions, parties and more, facilitating a unique community space for 11 days each August. Throughout the year, the Festival teams up with other arts and community groups to co-present queer film.

This innovative educational program is garnering critical acclaim! Out in Schools brings independent queer films into BC high schools to initiate discussions with students about school safety, homophobia and bullying. In 2007-2008 more than 2200 students attended over 40 presentations. Currently, we are in the process of developing lesson units for inclusion with Planning 10, a province-wide mandatory class for all grade 10 students. Additionally, youth are encouraged to make their own films through our FirstOUT workshops.



## QUEER HISTORY PROJECT

Our newest initiative, the Queer History Project aims to produce a lasting body of work that will enable our communities' stories to assume their rightful place in Canadian history. Two films have been commissioned thus far: The Love That Won't Shut Up by Ivan E Coyote and Veda Hille and Rex vs. Singh (p. 52) by John Greyson, Richard Fung and Ali Kazimi. Three more films are scheduled for production along with a community public art component that will culminate in 2011 when Vancouver celebrates its 125<sup>th</sup> anniversary. In the meantime, 2008 will see the launch of a community-driven, interactive website that explores and reimagines queer histories.

### **ABOUT LAIWAN**

Born in Zimbabwe, Laiwan's life and practice have been shaped by her early experiences growing up under apartheid rule. She came to Canada in 1977 to escape the war in Rhodesia. Since graduating from the Emily Carr Institute in 1983, Laiwan has been active as an artist, a writer/editor and an activist. In these various capacities, she has made indispensable contributions to queer and feminist communities as a social and cultural organizer. She founded the Or Gallery in 1983, was a founding member of the First Vancouver Lesbian Film Festival in 1988 and an organizer for the first Lotus Roots Gathering of Queer Asians in 1996. She served as editor for FRONT magazine from 1994 to 1997 and has contributed essays and writing to publications such as esse: arts + opinion, West Coast Line, Mix magazine and The Capilano Review. Her art practice is interdisciplinary and far-reaching; she has produced sound and video installations, online projects, book-works and video pieces. She has exhibited extensively, in solo exhibitions across Canada and in group exhibitions in the US, the UK, Europe and Japan.

She received her MFA from Simon Fraser University School for Contemporary Arts in 1999 and currently teaches in the MFA Interdisciplinary Arts Program at Goddard College in Washington State. Laiwan lives in East Vancouver with her cat Lily.

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## LIKE A VIRGIN (CHEONHAJANGSA MADONNA)

Chubby high school student Oh Dong-gu desperately wants to be a girl. Ridiculed in classes and stricken with a dysfunctional family, he takes solace in his rich fantasy life fuelled by, of course, Madonna. Working a back-breaking part-time job, Oh Dong-gu is saving up the 5 million won it will take for his sex-change operation, with little success. When the hunky new wrestling teacher makes an appearance, he takes a brief interest in the sport and even more so when he hears there's a huge cash prize awarded to the best Ssireum (traditional Korean wrestling) champion. He begins to train in earnest and despite some heavy obstacles – his violent, alcoholic father, his estranged mother and an unrequited love - he works toward achieving his dream (and teaches his fellow wrestlers some hot dance moves in the process). It ain't easy, but he's a boy with a mission: with Madonna in his heart and money on his mind, he wrestles his way towards girlhood.

Funny, touching and smart, **Like a Virgin** is one of a growing number of South Korean films distinguished by strong queer characters (*The King and the Clown* and *No Regret* come to mind). Oh Dong-gu's character takes

centre stage and (thanks to a wonderful performance by lead actor Deok-Hwan Ryu) emerges as an unforgettable queer hero. It takes guts, talent and whole lot of something special to make it through the wilderness and the kid does it with style. Madge would be proud.

**XXY** tells the story of Alex, an intersex teen who, raised as a girl, is now being pressured by family to "choose." Having moved the family from Buenos Aires to a remote seaside town in Uruguay, Alex's scientist father Kraken spends days saving injured sea creatures and gently trying to help Alex make this life-altering decision. Alex's relatively isolated existence is interrupted by the arrival of a surgeon (invited by Alex's mother to help with the "transition") and his son, Alvaro. As Alvaro and Alex begin a tentative friendship, the boy's own questions about sexuality surface and what begins as youthful experimentation quickly becomes a very adult confrontation with the limits of sex, sexuality and gender. Supported by Kraken, misunderstood by peers and struggling to understand the limits and possibilities of gender, Alex approaches the decision head-on. In both Alex's resolve and vulnerability, we see the profound importance of freedom of choice.

**XXY** is a remarkable example of international queer cinema that continues to push the boundaries of representation and the film hints at a whole realm of ground-breaking narrative possibilities. First-time director Lucía Puenzo

handles the film's difficult subject matter with grace; the character of Alex (played by the outstanding Inés Efron) beautifully illustrates the complex struggles facing gender-queer and intersex people: the fight for freedom of choice, for support and understanding and for a space to call one's own.



Our 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary is no small thing. The growth and progression of the Festival has been a shared experience and has depended on the hard work and support of so many: volunteers, staff, colleagues, donors and patrons. And new this year: the **20**<sup>th</sup> **Anniversary Award**, a juried prize given to an artist for a lifetime achievement to the queer media arts community. We are delighted to honour **Laiwan** for her enormous contribution to our community over the years.

Make sure to visit a retrospective exhibition of her work at the Or Gallery (see p. 27).

And last, but not least: a nod to some future directions. Taking our pilot website for the Queer History Project as a starting point, the panel **Creating Community Through Technology** (p. 60) takes a look at the possible futures of queer spaces online. As part of our ongoing visiting artist program, we are pleased to bring you these unique opportunities to see artists in collaboration.

Working in performance, video and sound, Montreal-based artist Lamathilde will be pairing up with festival performer Coral Short to bring you a unique sound/performance piece. The work will premiere at the Sexnoys party. Lamathilde and Short will also be giving a talk on their collaborative and solo practices on Saturday, August 16 at the Artist Swap (p. 4). 


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

Is bisexuality just a phase? Are bisexual men just lying? And of course, what does bisexuality have to do with aliens? The film's strength lies not in the answers it provides, but rather in the honest moments of reflection it captures of people discovering what it means to live outside the binaries.

Alexis Fosse Mackintosh (Let No One Put Asunder, 2004 Vancouver Queer Film Festival People's Choice Award winner) returns to the Festival with another documentary, this time investigating the complex (and raunchy and fun) arena of drag king performance and gender identity. What at first seems to be a portrait of Jessica Barrett (aka Lulu LeMoan), sorta straight drag king known to local audiences as part of Stilettos and Strap-Ons Burlesque, turns out to be a meditation on an array of pertinent issues. From a personal account of the public presentation of sexuality, to a discussion about the radical position that femme identities occupy in queer communities, interviews with the film's subject add valuable dimension to issues of contemporary queer culture.

Packed with plenty of great performance footage from Stilettos and Strap-Ons, the film delivers a thoughtful, sexy, scintillating package.

These two unique documentaries show the dangers and triumphs of refusing to shut up. In **The Beirut Apt**, Italian filmmakers rent an apartment so their Lebanese interview subjects – Muslims and Christians – can speak freely about their sexuality, even though the country's notorious Article 514 makes it illegal to do so. The small space of the apartment harbours issues of international importance. Despite different backgrounds and opinions, these eloquent men and women share the struggle to live authentically in a culture that denies their existence.

In **Darling!**, we meet "the most famous white woman in South Africa," Pieter-Dirk Uys, or rather his alter-ego, Mrs. Evita Bezuidenhout. In the 1980s, Evita's political satire skewered the policies of apartheid and earned her more than a little attention from the government and its enforcers. Today, Pieter-Dirk is a hero to thousands of South African children and counts Bishop Desmond Tutu and Nelson Mandela among his ardent fans – both of whom make appearances in the film. He remains an inspirational reminder of the capacity for a committed individual to promote social change.

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

Oscar-winning actress Tilda Swinton produced, wrote and serves as guide of this loving portrait of queer film maverick Derek Jarman – her mentor, collaborator and friend. Swinton and director Isaac Julien (Looking for Langston, Young Soul Rebels) deftly combine home movies, archival footage, scenes from Jarman's films and interviews with Jarman himself to create an insightful look at his life and work.

In classic interviews Jarman speaks frankly about his time as an art student in London during the swinging 1960s, his emergence as a filmmaker of homoerotic and controversial features (*Jubilee, Sebastiane, Caravaggio* and *Edward II*), his work with The Smiths and The Pet Shop Boys and his public battle with AIDS.

As a gay man living in Thatcher's Britain, Jarman used his art to build bridges and shout defiantly at the world. Swinton and Julien's film is a celebration of an extraordinary life in art.

Stuck in a summer athletics camp and bored out of their skulls, three Czech teenage girls decide to hit the highway in search of excitement. Sexual experimentation, excessive alcohol consumption and a yearning to take a bite out of whatever forbidden fruit comes their way are all on the agenda.

The slightly chubby Vendula wants to overcome her self-esteem issues, while the hyper-flirtatious Karolina simply wants to test her powers of seduction on every man she meets – including her best friend's little brother who's tagging along for the ride. And Iska? She's interested in pursuing her sudden attraction to Karolina, even if it means risking rejection and heartbreak.

Karin Babinská's debut feature may be both a coming out and a coming-of-age film, but this road movie is anything but a harmless, sugarcoated version of "Girls Gone Wild." There's perverse humour, poignant tragedy and some seriously steamy encounters on this threesome's painful journey to self-awareness and Sapphic awakenings. No punches are pulled, yet this portrait of that transitional period between childhood and adulthood always retains that recognizably giddy rush.

We are thrilled to present this innovative new film by Ali Kazimi (Continuous Journey, Narmada: A Valley Rises), Richard Fung (Sea in the Blood, Chinese Characters) and John Greyson (Lilies, Zero Patience). Commissioned by the Queer History Project, this is the second in a series of creative partnerships that reveals Vancouver's queer histories.

In 1915, two Sikh mill workers, Dalip Singh and Naina Singh, were entrapped by undercover police and accused of sodomy. Their trial – held less than one year after the infamous Komagata Maru incident of 1914, in which a ship carrying 376 migrants from British India was turned away – becomes a fascinating case study of Vancouver power relations: how police corruption, racism, homophobia and a covert "whites only" immigration policy conspired to maintain the status quo of this colonial port city.

The film stages scenes from the trial four times: first as a period drama, second as a documentary investigation of the case, third as a musical agitprop, and fourth, identical to the first, but without actors.

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

In Shamim Sarif's lush **The World Unseen**, the setting is Cape Town, South Africa, 1952. Under the harsh restrictions of apartheid, communities are closely policed and racial segregation is strictly enforced. Surviving against the odds is the Location Café, a watering hole run by the scandalously free-spirited Amina (Sheetal Seth). There, the rebellious Amina and her friends have created a small space of reprieve for their South Asian community.

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When she meets the timid, but unmistakably alluring Miriam (Lisa Ray from Deepa Mehta's Water), sparks fly. Miriam struggles with her traditional marriage to the abusive Omar and when her friendship with Amina grows, so too does her desire to transgress the stifling roles of wife and mother. Meanwhile, Amina's friend Jacob, an elderly black man, pursues a hopeful romance with a white woman. After weeks of building tension, the women's friendship takes a turn for the passionate, leaving two couples caught in the ever-rising tide of apartheid.

Her current works-inprogress are Christine in the Cutting Room (a documentary film about Christine Jorgensen) and Transsexual City (a book-length work on critical theory of embodiment, space and history).


